Dear Friends and Supporters of SLIP,

Our 2021-2022 Annual Report reflects a year of transition, as we moved from the limitations imposed by the pandemic and resumed our multi-faceted approach to fulfilling our mission of helping our older neighbors live independent, healthy and active lives.

The year involved a gradual return to education and community-enhancing programs, keeping the safety of our members and the people we serve uppermost. Those programs included:

- A very popular bell-ringers concert at Christmas time, which played to a full house;
- A Falls Prevention program held at the Saluda Fire Station featuring enlightening instruction by a physical therapist on exercises to help prevent falls, a presentation on SLIP's Home Safety program, and information about medical alert devices with fall-detection features; 50 people attended.
- Collaborating with the Church of the Transfiguration's "Towel Ministry" program by finding opportunities for a visiting youth group to assist older residents with home repairs;
- A Flag Day ceremony for the appropriate disposition of ten American flags needing to be taken out of service, attended by 25 people;

- On-going availability to conduct home safety inspections and provide assistance in making repairs;
- Participation (virtual) in the annual Village to Village Conference (funded by a grant from the Polk County Community Foundation);
- Hosting a pilot program entitled “Stronger Memory”

A major task toward the end of the program year was finding replacements for six Board members who were rotating off the Board and had played highly significant roles in establishing SLIP and bringing the fledgling organization into its present status as a very valuable community resource. Coming to the end of their tenure were Lynn Cass, Chair; Edie Campbell, Treasurer; DiAnne Arbour, Secretary; Frank McNutt, Home Safety Chair; Nancy Pew; and Deb Phillips. Nellie James has resigned from the Board but continues to be involved in SLIP activities. New members of the Board are Dr. Lisa Broyles; Cindy Hemenway, Neighbor to Neighbor Chair; Bruce Jayne, Vice Chair; Gary Miller, Treasurer; Ashley Sandahl, Communications Chair; Dr. Ravenel Smith, Home Safety Chair., and Mayor Tangie Morgan, Ex-officio. Remaining members of the Board are Kathy Beyer; Chip Broadfoot, Secretary; Patty Martin, RN, Neighbor to Neighbor Committee; Jane Ella Matthews, Transportation Chair; and Lin Savage, Chair.

An absolutely essential aspect of SLIP is the dedication and commitment of its volunteers. Very little of our mission could be accomplished without their whole-hearted availability to assist our older neighbors with their various needs. And their good work is attested to by some grateful comments from some of the people whom they have helped, and by comments from some of them as well.

- A volunteer with the Neighbor to Neighbor Committee had this to say: “I get just as much pleasure and enjoyment spending time with Dot as she tells me she does with me. I am glad I am a SLIP volunteer.”
- And from a neighbor who has received help from the Transportation Committee for doctor's appointments and other medical needs: “I really appreciate the volunteers at SLIP. I’m so glad we have an organization like SLIP here in Saluda, and I’ve heard other people say so, too. I’m grateful I can call one number to get a ride instead of calling one person after another.”
- After the Home Safety team helped a single, senior woman with several home safety issues, she was very grateful and said that she was finally happy and comfortable in her home. “The volunteers were polite and knowledgeable and were able to take care of my problem promptly and efficiently. “
- Frank McNutt, Home Safety Chair, connected SLIP with the Aspire Program, which works with Polk County youths assigned by the court to perform community service. The young people who have worked with Frank through that program have expressed their gratitude for having a more satisfying form of community service by providing home maintenance help for some of our older neighbors.

All of us who give gladly of our time and energy in carrying out the mission of Saluda Living In Place receive much satisfaction out of seeing our older neighbors in the Saluda area find ways to remain active and healthy. We are extremely grateful for your support for, and interest in, our endeavors. We could not accomplish the things we do without your help. Thank you!
